Miss SR Scholarship Pageant slated March 17

The Miss Slippery Rock State College Scholarship Pageant, which is sponsored by the Association of Resident Hall Students, will be held on March 17 in Miller Auditorium.

Dawn Wilson, last year's pageant winner, will crown this year's Miss SRSC. The winner will receive \$500. She will get \$300 cash, and \$200 for a wardrobe to wear at the state pageant. The first runner-up will get \$200, the second runner-up will receive \$150, the third runner-up will receive \$100, and the

receive \$50.

Any women who applies must meet these qualifications, which will be checked and cleared:

1. Must have 2.0 QPA.
2. Must be single, never been married, and be a full-time undergraduate student at SRSC.
3. Must be planning to graduate no earlier than December, 1982.
4. Must be a citizen of the United States.
5. Must be no younger than 17 nor older than 26 as of September 1, 1982.
6. Must meet all qualifica-

tions set forth by Miss America Pageant guidelines.

The areas of competition will be Swimsuit, Gown, Talent, Interview, and General Appearance, and if two women are found to be doing the same number or piece, the one who returned her application with talent description first will be permitted to perform her talent, and the other must change.

The crowned winner will be the student director for next year's pageant.

Here is an "Out of the Past" picture recently mailed to the Rocket office by a former Rocket editor, Douglas A. Lehman, class of 1940 came across this old photo of the infamous North Hall fire on October 16, 1936. Lehman said that the men who resided in the old Sought Hall helped to battle the 5 a.m. fire. "We were looking forward to Homecoming that Saturday," recalls Lehman, "and we expected our opponents' fan (Westminster) to pay us a prank visit in the wee hours of the morning." The South Hall men then planned ahead of time for the surprise. "We instructed the freshmen who were on guard to ring the fire alarm if Westminster invaded campus," said Lehman. The ironic thing was, the siren signal was given and for sure it was a real fire!
