Choir performs Heritage theme

The Slippery Rock State College Choir and Chamber Singers, directed by Dr. Chester O'Bannon, will honor our American Heritage at their spring concert on Sunday at 4 p.m. in the Swope Music Building Auditorium.

This year's concert, entitled "Songs of American Folks," will be highlighted by the College Choir's presentation of the "Testament of Freedom," a patriotic work by Randall Thompson who set the musical text to the writings of Thomas Jefferson. A slide presentation of revolutionary art works compiled by Robert Crayne of the SRSC art department will be projected at the "Testament of Freedom" is performed.

The Chamber Singers will open the performance with works by Kirk Mechem, Vincent Persichetti, Theron Kirk, and Alice Parker in

addition to a medley of numbers from the popular musical "The Fantastiks."

Over the past six years, Dr. O'Bannon has directed the SRSC Choir in virtually every major city in the east at special programs and on radio and TV. The singers recorded for the Voice of America in 1973, and more recently appeared on TV station in Chicago and Toronto, Canada. The SRSC Choir and Chamber Singers will embark on their annual spring tour on May 16.

A long list of musical accomplishments follow O'Bannon who has directed choirs at SRSC since 1971. He holds degrees from the University of Kansas City, Catholic University of America, and the Conservatory of Music of the University of Missouri at Kansas City. O'Bannon has sung with the

Kansas City Lyric Opera, the Opera Society in Washington D.C., and the U.S. Army Chorus, where he was a featured soloist. He also served as acting musical director of the Mendelssohn Choir of Pittsburgh. More recently, O'Bannon was baritone soloist for the presentation of Handel's MESSIAH by the Symphonic Choir and the Orchestra at SRSC.

Before coming to Slippery Rock, O'Bannon was on the faculty at Pensacola Florida Community College and the University of West Florida. Among his honors in the education field, O'Bannon received the Outstanding Educator in America award in 1973, and was named Outstanding Music Professor at SRSC in 1978. The SRSC Choir and Chamber Singers concert is free and open to the public.
