## Orchestra prepares for debut

In a unique blending of the college campus and the Slippery Rock community, the Slippery Rock State College-Community Orchestra will present its spring concert on May 2 under the direction of Sandra Dackow, a music professor at SRSC. The orchestra is a novelty to the area because of its combination of young and old, students and faculty, townspeople and merchants. Anyone can participate in the College-Community Orchestra regardless of his profession. The concert opens at 4 p.m. in the Swope music building. Demonstrating their versatility will be SR area residents Katherine Conway, a nurse with the Slippery Rock School District, playing violin, cellists Peter Surgenor,

minister and director of Camp Crestfield; Sue Schaffer, an SRSC alumnus and elementary teacher; and Dr. W.G. Saver, professor of chemistry at the college. The viola player is Kenneth Quast, the manager of the Shamrock Golf Course. Two of the secretaries at SRSC will also perform; Joanne Santus of the nursing department, violin, and LaDonna Linamen, of the maintenance center on French horn. Art professor Robert Crayne will play trombone along with Dr. Robert Macoskey, professor of philosophy. Several of the wives and children of SRSC faculty will be performing as a part of the campus-community orchestra. Julie Megnin, cello, Kathy McQuiston, violin, and Stacey Steele, viola. Youngsters participating include Sarah

Lamson, Kirk Sayre, Erick Larson, and Mike, Charles, and Marcia Mennell, all on violin, and Matt Crayne, tuba. Exhibiting their adeptness at instruments other than their primary interest will be Dr. Edward Sims, who teaches piano playing the oboe; organ instructor and choir director George Bentel will play trumpet; and music therapists Jim McQuiston and Sue Shuttleworth will play bass and clarinet. Along with their mentors will be about 40 students of the college whose own majors range everywhere from recreation management to business administration. A specially featured segment in the program will be the Slippery Rock Brandenburg Ensemble, a chamber-sized group comprised of members of the orchestra's string section, who will perform a concertino composed

by Giovanni Battista Pergolesi. A repeat performance will be staged on May 3 at 8 p.m. in the Clearview mall in Butler. Interested individuals from the college or community may contact the group's director, Sandra Dackow, at 794-7237 for next fall's orchestra.
