

Theta Chi selected for service award

The Butler County Chapter of the American Diabetes Association has selected Theta Chi Fraternity of SRSC for the 1982 Annual Award for outstanding community service. In a special ceremony at the Butler V.A. Medical Center Auditorium on November 15th. The award was presented to Theta Chi President, Jim Brennan, and Parliamentarian, Jeff Taylor. The presentation was made by Dr. William H. R. Willkens, Chairman of the Board of Directors of the Chapter.

The community service award reads: "The 1982 Annual Diabetes Month Award for Community Service has been granted to Theta Chi

Fraternity, Slippery Rock State College, in recognition of outstanding service to the Butler County Chapter of the American Diabetes Association in fund raising and in the distribution of diabetes education literature."

Commenting on the award, Dr. Willkens noted that Theta Chi members have distributed hundreds of copies of the warning signs of diabetes and they have collected about \$375 each of the past two years during National Diabetes Month. The drive for this year is only half completed and already the fraternity has collected well over \$500.

Graduate assistantship available for spring

The Department of Academic Support Services announces the availability of a graduate assistantship effective the spring semester 1983.

The department administers programs primarily for students who are considered educationally, culturally, and/or economically disadvantaged. These students are offered a variety of services including academic advisement, personal counseling, tutoring, and other services which will enhance the student's success in a college environment. It is in this context that graduate assistants are employed. A general description of their duties is as follows:

Advise and counsel students in matters relating to academic and personal adjustment.

Engage in tutorial activities indigenous to student needs.

Assist in individual departmental research activities.

Attend and serve on departmental committees.

Assist in the recruitment of prospective students.

Assist in the planning, preparation, and implementation of departmental programs.

Prepare monthly reports of work activities.

Post and maintain regular office hours.

Assume special work responsibilities assigned by immediate supervisor or department chairperson.

Graduate assistants receive a stipend of \$2,705 per academic year plus a waiver of tuition. They must maintain a graduate course load of nine hours per semester. They are also expected to carry a work load of 16 to 20 hours per week in departmental assignments.
