Murderer jailed

(AP)—A 28-year-old mother who admitted killing her one-month-old son was sentenced to a minimum of eight years in prison.

Sharon Kay Comitz bowed her head and cried as the judge in Centre County court ordered that she serve between eight and 20 years in the women's state correctional institution at Muncy. Her attorneys would not comment immediately on whether they plan to appeal.

Comitz lives in Osceola Mills. She pleaded guilty but mentally ill to third-degree murder in the death of her son, Garret, last June. The baby's body was found in a small mountain stream in Centre County in January.

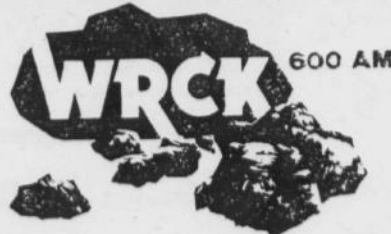
