#### Attempts to increase business

The Slippery Rock Chamber of Commerce is going under a revitalization stage in hopes of bringing more business to the community.

According to attorney Joseph Brydon, temporary president, the major change is to rename the commerce from Slippery Rock to Slippery Rock Area.

The name change is to increase the membership from the area as well as in the borough," Brydon said.

Last year, several members of the executive staff took employment

outside the area or resigned, leaving Brydon, then vice-president, as the only officer.

Earlier this year, Brydon was approached several by representatives from the community about revitalizing the commerce.

A Slippery Rock University student was seriously injured in a car accident, while traveling westbound on Route 422 in the Kittanning area Thursday, Feb. 16 at 11:30

Jay Kammerdiener, 21, of Petrolia, P.A. is listed in critical but stable condition in the intensive care unit at Allegheny General Hospital in Pittsburgh.

According to Lisa Barber, Kammerdiener's girlfriend, Kammerdiener's car struck an embankment. He was thrown from the car which landed on him.

He was found by a passing Kittanning doctor and taken

to nearby Kittanning hospital.

From there, Barber said that Kimmerdiener was flown by life-flight helicopter to Allegheny General Hospital and admitted to the shock trauma unit and listed in critical condition.

Barber said that doctors

operated on him soon after arrival, with the surgery lasting an approximate 5 hours.

McConnell will be out for the rest of the season and will miss the playoffs.


Rhoads also stated that McConnell was a team player who would be greatly missed during the playoffs.
