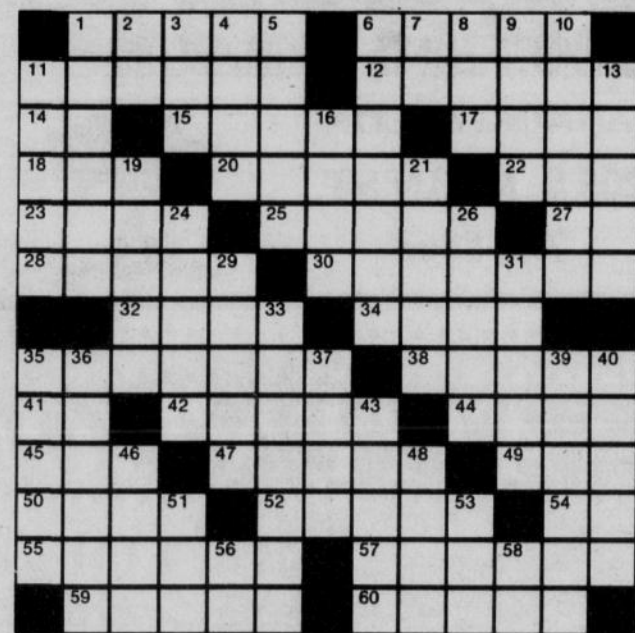
Alpha Xi Delta
